Presidents Report

Doggy Etiquette

Please ensure you have full control of your dog at all times. Like humans, dogs need their personal space. Please check with other handlers before letting your dog approach another. Some timid dogs can be greatly stressed when boisterous dogs approach, sometimes causing aggression. Some of our dogs are still learning to be nice to each other and progress can be hindered after an unpleasant encounter. You may see a yellow ribbon or scarf used to indicate a very timid dog. Please be aware of this and respect each other.

- Please remember to sign in at the desk and pay your \$2 grounds fee to your instructor each week.
- When signing in, please CLEARLY print your name (not your dog's!), your membership number and which class you are in to help with our records.



Tips and Tricks

Ideas to Help Keep Your Dog Cool in Summer

- 1. Make sure your dog has access to shade during the day. On particularly hot days, let your dog inside to enjoy the air conditioning with you.
- 2. Make sure your dog has access to water. It is best to have a number of different water containers in case one is knocked over.
- 3. Provide a paddling pool to play in. You can add toys and even frozen treats to entice them into the pool.
- 4. Give your dog cool treats like ice cream, frozen kongs or home made pupsicles made from your dogs favourite treats.
- 5. Set up a sprinkler for some fun play time. You can also buy cooling mats or vests to help them if they are struggling with the heat.
- 6. Walk your dog in the cooler times of the day, not only is it more comfortable temperature wise, but pavements can get very hot during the heat of the day and even burn their paws.
- 7. **NEVER** leave your pet in your car unattended, dogs can over heat and die within minutes.

The Five Second Rule: Place the back of your hand on the pavement, it you can't hold it there for at least 5 seconds, it's too hot to walk your dog.



Frozen Strawberry Smoothie



Ingredients

2 cups of Sliced Strawberries or a 500g bag of Frozen Strawberries 1½ cups Plain Greek Low Fat Yogurt 1 sliced banana (if you have two...use them both) ¼ cup of Skim Milk 3 tablespoons of Honey

Directions:

- 1. Place all the ingredients in your blender at medium speed for approx 2 minutes.
- 2. Pour into the molds of your choice or use ice cube trays
- 3. Freeze for 4 hours or more before serving

Sealed and stored properly, these will keep in the freezer for 2 months (but they will never last that long because your pups will have them gone in no time).



You can use other fruits or veggies instead of strawberries, try using Watermelon, Blueberries, Mango, Pumpkin or any other dog safe fruit or veg (not grapes). Banana's add a creaminess that no other fruit can offer. You can even add some Peanut Butter. Tailor them to your dogs tastes but it's guaranteed, they will love this blend for sure.
