

- 6. Remember to pick up after your dog.

Enrichment 9 deas for Dogs

There are many ways to enrich your dog's life. Here are a couple of suggestions to help keep your canine pal happy...

- 1. Feed your dog his meals out of food toys. The pet supply companies have finally caught up with the current behavioral recommendations and as a result offer innumerable numbers of food toys. This takes a very small event eating dinner — that usually takes 5 minutes and turns it into an event that could last an hour.
- 2. Get your dog out of the house. An excursion in the car, or just down the street will enrich your dog's life and mentally wear him out.
- 3. Schedule doggie play dates. There is nothing like off-leash dog play to wear a dog flat out.
- 4. Rotate your dogs' toys so that your dogs have 3 toys per dog in the household per day. Keep the toys out of rotation for 5 days.
- 5. Purchase some puzzle toys. Puzzle toys are toys which test your dog's intelligence by making finding treats more challenging.
- 6. Set up a sand pit in the back yard where you can bury toys and treats for your dog to find.

7.In summer have a paddling pool full of water, add toys and treats frozen into a big ice block. Provides hours of fun and helps keep them cool.

Doggy Etiquette

Please ensure you have full control of your dog at all times. Like humans, dogs need their personal space. Please check with other handlers before letting your dog approach another. Some timid dogs can be greatly stressed when boisterous dogs approach, sometimes causing aggression. Some of our dogs are still learning to be nice to each other and progress can be hindered after an unpleasant encounter. You may see a yellow ribbon or scarf used to indicate a very timid dog.



Midland Dog Training Club Winter Tips for Dogs

Good Exercise

Keep your pet warm and healthy during winter and prevent any extra kilos creeping on with plenty of exercise.

2. Regular Health Checks

Don't forget to take your furry friend to the vet for a winter health check-up. Older pets in particular are susceptible to chilly temperatures and you may notice them start to slow down over the next few months.

3. Fresh Water

Pets still require plenty of fresh water in winter especially when they are spending time indoors as the heating can dehydrate them guickly. If you live in a particularly cold area, be sure to check your pet's water bowl regularly to make sure that it has not iced over.

4. Warm and Comfy Bedding


Now is the time to reconsider where to house your pet overnight. If your pet sleeps outside, provide them with a warm place to sleep and rest utilising thicker bedding, warm jackets and even microwavable heat pillows if necessary.

5. Maintain Grooming Regime

Don't forget your pet still needs to be groomed during the winter months as well as the summer ones. Many pet parents leave their dogs and cats coats to grow long over winter in an attempt to keep them warm but this can lead to some skin problems, matting and long hours of brushing and trying to get those knots out. Ensure that your pet is comfortable and continue to get them clipped to a manageable length.


