Presidents Report

- 4. Dogs must be on a lead at all times, unless instructed otherwise
- 5. Membership badges must be worn
- 6. Remember to pick up after your dog.

Doggy Etiquette

Please ensure you have full control of your dog at all times. Like humans, dogs need their personal space. Please check with other handlers before letting your dog approach another. Some timid dogs can be greatly stressed when boisterous dogs approach, sometimes causing aggression. Some of our dogs are still learning to be nice to each other and progress can be hindered after an unpleasant encounter. Please also respect the spaces of dogs that may be tethered on a stake or in a crate. Just because they might be waiting patiently, it doesn't mean they will want to greet anyone. You may see a yellow ribbon or scarf used to indicate a very timid dog. We ask that you be aware of this and respect each other.

- Please remember to sign in at the desk and pay your \$2 grounds fee to your instructor each week.
- When signing in, please CLEARLY print your name (not your dog's!), your membership number and which class you are in to help with our records.

Tips and Tricks



Ideas to Help Keep Your Pets safe this Christmas

- Create a safe space for your pet perhaps a spare bedroom or Laundry – where they can escape the commotion. Put food, water, toys and a bed in there
- 2. If you're having guests make sure children are supervised when they are near your pet to avoid injury to either party. Make sure all visitors know to close any doors, windows or gates to stop a panicked pet making an accidental escape
- 3. Keep cables from Christmas tree lights out of reach or get a cable guard they can't chew through
- 4. Vacuum regularly to reduce the risk of real or fake pine needles being ingested by your pet
- Avoid feeding traditional festive foods to your dog. Some ingredients in things like Christmas cake and puddings can be highly toxic and risk your dogs health
- 6. Don't use edible decorations on your tree, they will be sniffed out and pulled down. Likewise, if a gift contains food or chocolate don't leave it under the tree. Your pet might open it before you get the chance and eat something that's dangerous to them
- 7. Christmas plants may look pretty but poinsettias, mistletoe, holly, amaryllis, ferns and pine sap are poisonous to cats and dogs
- 8. Don't give your pet cooked bones they can splinter and cause serious issues for your pet. This includes ham bones which are also high in fat and can make your pet very sick
- 9. Keep up your pets regular feeding and exercise routines to minimise upheaval
- 10. Involve your pet in the fun by treating them to a new toy, collar or bowl

Frozen Strawberry Smoothie



Ingredients

2 cups of Sliced Strawberries or a 500g bag of Frozen Strawberries 1½ cups Plain Greek Low Fat Yogurt 1 sliced banana (if you have two...use them both) ¼ cup of Skim Milk 3 tablespoons of Honey

Directions:

- 1. Place all the ingredients in your blender at medium speed for approx 2 minutes.
- 2. Pour into the molds of your choice or use ice cube trays
- 3. Freeze for 4 hours or more before serving

Sealed and stored properly, these will keep in the freezer for 2 months (but they will never last that long because your pups will have them gone in no time).
